**RFD – Schedule "A" Compensation Rates for County Services** - MOVED by Councillor Elliott that County Policy Manual - Schedule "A" Compensation Rates for County Services, Page G-2 be updated to include: digital copies at \$0.50 per sheet, a \$10.00 charge per USB stick required and staff time involved to research requested information be charged accordingly.

<u>Castor & District Museum Board</u> - MOVED by Councillor Glazier that if Councillor Hewitt is appointed to the Castor & District Museum Board that he be covered under the County's liability.

In regards to the outstanding issue facing the County's Development Appeal Board and 10 Wind Turbine permits currently under appeal, the Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) recently released their decision on the Capital Power application. The AUC found that the application met the requirements of being in the interests of Alberta power generation, and approved the project with conditions that were brought on by the representatives from the Battle River group (BRG), the same group appealing the 10 County permits. The Development Appeal Board met for a 3<sup>rd</sup> time on April 23 at the County office to determine a course of action in view of the AUC decision, a decision that over-rides the County's authority as outlined in S. 619 of the Municipal Government Act (MGA). As the BRG had retained new Council as of Friday April 20, an adjournment of the proceedings was made until June 11<sup>th</sup> where all parties will reconvene to discuss the implications of the AUC decision, and if there is - or will be - any matters left to decide on at the Appeal Board level given the AUC approval. ### STRYCHNINE LIQUID CONCENTRATE

2% liquid strychnine concentrate will be available for purchase for the 2018 season starting **March 21, 2018** through the ASB. Product will be sold in 250mL bottles at a cost of **\$10.50 each**. One bottle will treat 1kg of grain (e.g. a 5 gallon or 12kg pail would require 12 bottles). A minimum order of 6, 250mL bottles is required to a maximum of 72 (there are 24 bottles/case).

**PRE-ORDERS WILL NOT BE TAKEN**. Pickup at the County shop will be Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11:30 a.m. -12:00 p.m., at which time payment will be collected (**please bring a cheque**). Feel free to call ahead to Trevor Kerr at 403.740.9182 for availability.
