Coronation RCMP Encouraging Residents to Join the #9PMRoutine

Coronation, Alta. – RCMP along with the County Community Peace Officer are advising the public to ensure their properties are secured and valuables removed from their vehicles.

The Coronation RCMP are requesting residents within Paintearth County follow simple steps for crime prevention, such as those outlined in the #9PMRoutine. Getting in a daily routine of checking the security of your property can deter crime and protect your hard-earned belongings.

Most thefts are crimes of opportunity which means that the criminal is looking for unlocked vehicles or houses where they can easily steal property. By removing valuables from vehicles and by locking cars and homes, we remove the easy opportunity and most criminals will then move on to easier pickings.

The #9PMRoutine recommends:

- Removing valuables from vehicles.
- Ensuring vehicles are locked, windows are closed and if possible, parked in a garage.
- Closing garage doors and windows.
- Locking all doors in the garage, including those leading into a house.
- Checking that all house doors – front, back, side and garage – are locked.
- Ensuring all windows are shut.
- Turning on an exterior light.

2% LIQUID STRYCHNINE

The County has ordered more Strychnine. ASB will continue to sell strychnine on Tuesday's and Thursday's. Product will be sold in 250mL bottles of concentrate at a cost of **\$10.50 each**. One bottle will treat 1kg of grain (e.g. a 5 gallon or 12kg pail would require 12 bottles). A minimum order of six (6) 250mL bottles is required to a maximum of 96 (there are 24 bottles/case).

PRE-ORDERS WILL NOT BE TAKEN. Pickup at the County shop will be on Tuesday's and Thursday' s from 11:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m., at which time payment will be collected (please bring a cheque). When picking up product, please come prepared with the following information:

- **Mailing address of purchaser**
- **Telephone number of purchaser**
- **Home quarter**
- **Legal Land Descriptions of where product will be used**
- **Type of field(s) to be treated (crop, forage, or pasture)**
- **Approximate infested area of each field type**
- **Approximate farm size**

If you are picking up product for more than one landowner, please bring the above-mentioned information for all landowners.

ROADSIDE MOWING

The roadside mowing has been going strong and ASB staff have completed Division 1, 2, and 3. The program will continue in Division 4, 5, 6, and 7. Depending on weather conditions staff will then mow in Division 1 again and continue with a two-pass mow on the major arterial roads. Please contact the Director of Environmental Services, Jeff Cosens at 403-882-3211, if you **do not** want your roadside mowed.

ROADSIDE SPRAYING

ASB staff have completed the roadside spraying in Division 7, 1 and part of 6. Staff will continue to spray for brush and for some of the major noxious weeds or any other prohibited noxious weeds.

RECYCLING

Please make sure when recycling that all containers have been rinsed properly and there is no product left in the containers. Containers which have product left in them are not used for recycling and end up in a landfill. Also, make sure that anything placed in the recycling bins is recyclable. If you are unsure check the County of Paintearth No. 18 website under waste as there is a list of products which are acceptable or ask the Attendant on site.

PROPANE BOTTLES AND AEROSOL CANS

Propane Bottles of any type Do No Go into The Metal Piles. Each Transfer Station has a designated area for propane bottles. When propane bottles are placed into other areas, they create a hazard to people who are working at the sites or residents who use the sites. Aerosol cans such as WD40, insect repellents and wasp sprays are not to be placed in metal piles or paint recycling containers. These aerosol products must be taken to the Household Hazardous Waste Roundup held yearly in the spring. Again, by putting these materials in metal piles or paint bins they may create a risk of serious injury to someone.

RAILWAY RIGHT OF WAY

A reminder the right of way should not be used by ATVs, Snowmobilers or vehicles. The railway right of way is solely for the purpose of a utility corridor and not for recreational use.
