RFD – Write Off Tax Rolls Totalling \$17,294.84 - MOVED by Councillor Hewitt the following Tax Rolls 46000010 - \$712.15, 70004030 - \$638.98, 46000240 - \$19.47, 46214900 - \$391.69, 48469300 - \$1,012.50, 70003940 - \$825.87, 70010920 - \$3,692.17, 70010930 - \$3,692.17 and 70011420 - \$6,309.84 totalling \$17,294.84 including penalties be written off.

County of Stettler – Letter to Hon. Kaycee Madu re IDP's & ICF's - MOVED by Councillor Wiart the County support and send correspondence to the County of Stettler in their request to delay or discontinue for requirements for Intermunicipal Development Plans and Intermunicipal Collaboration Frameworks.

RFD – Bridge Repairs Deferred to 2020 - MOVED by Councillor Glazier to change the completion date for bridge repair projects on BF 13285 SSE 15-35-11 W4 (Lake Thelma), BF 70198 SNW 16-37-9 W4 (Guse), and BF 71531 WSW 32-36-9 W4 (Rodvang) to October 31, 2020 and the tender be released.
